STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT giving a lien on pressed hay for personal services in pressing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who performs, or furnishes 2 labor, in pressing hay in this state, shall have a lien 3 thereon for his personal services, to continue so long as 4 such hay remains in the county where pressed, not, 5 however, to exceed fifteen days from the time the last 6 labor is performed or furnished; and whenever any 7 part of said hay has been removed beyond the county 8 where pressed, the lien shall attach to the remainder 9 of any given part for the whole labor so performed or 10 furnished, which lien shall take precedence of all other

11 claims, and be enforced by attachment within the time12 aforesaid.

SECT. 2. In such processes the plaintiff may require 2 the officer making the attachment to attach hay in 3 value double the amount of his claim, and the writ 4 shall be framed accordingly.

SECT. 3. The provisions of sections thirty-six and 2 thirty-seven of chapter ninety-one, of revised statutes 3 of this state, shall apply to this act.
