STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, 2 to be expended under the direction of the governor and 3 council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of 4 Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, as follows, viz: For May dividend, four hundred dollars; for Novem-5 6 ber dividend, three hundred dollars; for distressed 7 poor, twelve hundred dollars; for agricultural pur-8 poses, five hundred dollars; for bounties on crops, for 9 the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, 10 three hundred dollars; for plowing, one hundred and 11 fifty dollars; for salary of governors, fifty dollars each; 12 for salary of lieutenant governor at Peter Deny's point, 13 twenty dollars; for wood, one hundred and fifty dol-14 lars; for educational purposes, three hundred dollars; 15 for salary for priest, one hundred dollars; for contin-

16 gent fund, one hundred dollars; for salary of agent,
17 three hundred dollars; for painting chapel at Peter
18 Deny's point, seventy-five dollars; for painting school
19 house, thirty-five dollars; plastering and 'repairing
20 hall, fifty dollars; also seventy-five dollars for fixing
21 hall at Pleasant Point; also fifty dollars for repairing
22 road from Peter Deny's point to the Granger turnpike.
