## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of James F. Farmer, James E. Weston, George Walls, Oliver P. Merriman, Edwin L. Reed, Winfield S. Evans, Timothy Tucker and Patrick St. John, of township number two, range five.

---

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and hereby is authorized to convey to the following named parties of township numbered two, range five, in the county of Aroostook, the lots in the east half of said township set against their respective names, viz :

To James F. Farmer, lot number two, range four ; to James E. Weston, lot number three, range four ; to George Walls, lot number eight, range five ; to Oliver P. Merriman, lot number four, range five ; to Edwin L. Reed, lot number five, range four ; to Winfield S. Evans, lot number eight, range four ; to Timothy

- 12 Tucker, lot number seven, range four ; to Patrick St.  
13 John, lot number eleven, range five ; when paid for by  
14 labor on road, waiving further settling duties.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

---

The lots of land mentioned in this resolve, are inconveniently located for settlement, and of but little value for agricultural purposes; so that no settler has ever been induced to settle upon them, or make any improvement upon them. The Land Committee believe that it is for the interest of the State to convey said lots to the holders of certificates on payment of usual road labor, waiving other settling duties; such certificates appearing to be held by actual settlers on neighboring lots.

*Resolved*, That the land agent is empowered to convey lots numbered 2, range 4; 3, range 4; 8, range 5; 4, range 5; 5, range 4; 8, range 4; 7, range 4; and 11, range 5, in the east half of township number two, range five, to the parties entitled thereto, when they may be paid for in road labor, waiving all other settling duties.
