STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Andrew Wiren of Woodland plantation.

Resolved, That Andrew Wiren of Woodland plantation be given by the land agent or other proper officer, a deed of lot numbered thirty-one in said plantation, further settling duties being waived.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of Maine
in Legislature assembled:*

Respectfully represents Andrew Wiren of Woodland plantation, that he is resident upon Lot No. 32 in said plantation, having purchased it from Samuel Johnson, understanding at the time that he could purchase from the State the adjoining Lot No. 31, and consequently he took a certificate of said Lot No. 31 for the purpose of making it a part of his farm. That he has cleared more than fifty acres on Lot 32, erected a house 20x44 feet and a barn 36x45 feet. That nearly all the remaining portion of Lot 32 is swamp and unfit for improvement; therefore the said Lot 31 is essential to the making of a good farm. That on account of time devoted to his duties as pastor of the Swedish colony and teacher of their schools, he prays that said Lot 31 may be granted to him without further settling duties.
