STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the south hay stack road in Castle
Hill in Argostook county.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be

- 2 and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended
- 3 upon the county road running through south part of
- 4 Castle Hill township, known as south hay stack road.
- 5 And the governor and council are hereby authorized
- 6 to draw a warrant on the treasurer therefor, payable
- 7 to the treasurer of said plantation, when the assessors
- 8 of Castle Hill plantation shall certify, under oath, that
- 9 said road is completed, and said affidavit received by
- 10 governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The old mail route between Presque Isle and Dalton at present follows an old and what at first was a lumber road, making the distance between these two points, 24 miles; the county commissioners in 1871 or '72, laid out a new road leading direct from Dalton to Presque Isle and through the southern part of Castle Hill plantation, saving a distance of about six miles travel; this road is built from both points to Castle Hill township. The plantation has done all they feel able do, but will have to either in money or labor expend somewhere about fifteen hundred dollars to finish said road. The valuation of the estates in said township is about (\$21,000) twenty-one thousand dollars. The coming season is the last chance given them to complete said road by the county commissioners, and they feel totally unable to finish. All of the settlers are upon the old road; the new road runs most of the way through State land in said township.

These facts I have from the settlers and assessors of the plantation.
