STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT giving to municipal and police courts jurisdiction in matters of liens upon personal property in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The ninety-first chapter of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section :

“ Sect. 48. The municipal and police courts of the several cities and towns in this state shall have jurisdiction concurrent with the supreme judicial court and trial justices in their respective counties, over liens and proceedings relative thereto, for an amount not exceeding the sum which limits the jurisdiction of such

10 courts in civil actions, to be enforced as provided in
11 this chapter.”

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved
2 by the governor.
