STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the duties of secretary of state.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section thirty-six of chapter two of the
2 revised statutes, relating to the duties of secretary of
3 state, is hereby amended so as to read as follows :
4 “All stationery required for the actual official use of
5 the secretary of state, state treasurer, adjutant general,
6 land agent, superintendent of public schools, governor,
7 members of the executive council, senate and represen-
8 tatives in the legislature, secretary of the senate and
9 clerk of the house, and for no other purposes, shall be
10 purchased at the lowest wholesale price by the secre-
11 tary of state, with the direction of the governor and
12 council. The secretary of state shall carefully compare

13 every lot of stationery received with the invoice, and
14 ascertain that a full delivery of the amount charged is
15 made, and shall also keep an accurate record of all that
16 is distributed, and annually in the month of December
17 render an account of the articles purchased, distributed,
18 and remaining on hand; which account, with the
19 original invoices, shall be examined and the stock on
20 hand compared therewith by the council.

SECT. 2. All acts and resolves inconsistent with the
2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
