STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Silver Ridge plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred sixty-five dol-

- 2 lars and seventy-five cents be and the same is hereby
- 3 appropriated in aid of building road in Silver Ridge
- 4 plantation, leading from Edgley's mill on the Silver
- 5 Ridge road leading to Kingman. Said sum being a
- 6 balance of proceeds of land sold to build a bridge in
- 8 said plantation in eighteen hundred seventy-four.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

A resolve was passed in 1874, appropriating land in Silver Ridge plantation for the purpose of building a bridge over Molunkus stream. The land was sold for seven hundred dollars, the bridge was built at a cost of five hundred thirty-four dollars and twenty-five cents; the balance was paid into the treasury, being one hundred sixty-five dollars and seventy-five cents, the exact amount asked for in the resolve. One mile of road is to be made from the bridge above named, to the Kingman road, through Greenwood; and this appropriation is needed very much to aid the citizens in opening the said road.
