STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the constitution of Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution 2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of 3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

BRIBERY AT ELECTIONS.

No person who shall receive, expect, or offer to 6 7 receive, or pay, offer, or promise to pay, contribute, offer or 8 promise to contribute to another, to be paid or used, any money 9 or other valuable thing as a compensation or reward for the 10 giving or withholding a vote at an election, or who shall make 11 any promise to influence the giving or withholding any such 12 vote, or who shall make or become directly or indirectly inter-13 ested in any bet or wager depending upon the result of any 14 election, shall vote at such election; and, upon challenge for 15 such cause, the person so challenged, before the officers author-16 ized for that purpose shall receive his vote, shall swear or affirm, 17 before such officers, that he has not received or offered, does 18 not expect to receive, has not paid, offered or promised to pay, 19 and does not intend to pay; contributed, offered or promised to 20 contribute, and does not intend to contribute to another, to be 21 paid or used, any money or other valuable thing, as a compensa-22 tion or reward for the giving or withholding a vote at such 23 election, nor made or become directly or indirectly interested 24 in any bet or wager, depending upon the result of such election.

Section 2. The legislature, at the session thereof next after 2 the adoption of this section, shall, and from time to time 3 thereafter may, enact laws excluding from the right of suffrage 4 perpetually, or for a term of years, all persons convicted of 5 bribery at any election, or of voting at any election under the 6 influence of a bribe.
