STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution 2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of 3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

4 No. 4.

- 5 BIENNIAL ELECTIONS AND BIENNIAL SESSIONS.
- 6 The Governor, Senators and Representatives in the Legisla-
- 7 ture shall be elected biennially, and hold office two years from
- 8 the first Wednesday of January next succeeding their election.
- 9 And the Legislature, at the first session next after the adoption
- 10 of this Article, shall make all needful provisions by law in 11 relation to the tenure of office of all County officers. The first
- 12 election under this Article shall be in the year one thousand
- 12 election under this Article shall be in the year one thousand 13 eight hundred and seventy-six; and the Legislature shall
- 14 thereafter convene on the first Wednesday of January, bienni-
- 15 ally.
- 16 Section four of Article two, Section five of Part two, Arti-
- 17 cle four, Section one of Part three, Article four, Section two,
- 18 Part two, Article five, Section one, Part three of Article five,
- 19 Section one of Part four, Article five, Section four, Article
- 20 nine, and Articles nine and ten of the Amendments are amend-
- 21 ed by substituting the word "biennially," for the word "annu-
- 22 ally," wherever it occurs. Section two, Part one, Article
- 23 five, is amended by striking out all after the word "office," and
- 24 substituting therefor the words "for two years from the first

25 Wednesday of January next following the election." Section 26 thirteen of same Part and Article, Section four of Part four of 27 same Article, and Article nine of the Amendments are amended 28 by substituting the word "biennial" for the word "annual," 29 wherever it occurs, except in Section eight in reference to Mu 30 nicipal and Police Judges. Section four of Article ten i. 31 amended by substituting the words "biennial meetings in the 32 month of November," for the words "annual meetings in the 33 month of September." Article ten of the Amendments is 34 further amended in paragraph two, as printed in the Revised 35 Statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, relative to the 36 voting of persons in the military service, so that said para-37 graph shall read as follows: "Citizens of this State, absent 38 therefrom in the military service of the United States, and not 39 in the regular army, being otherwise qualified electors, shall be 40 allowed to vote, on the day fixed for the State election, for such 41 State and County officers as are chosen by popular vote, under 42 such rules and regulations as the Legislature may prescribe." Section two, Part one of Article four, is amended, by strik-44 ing out the words, "for one year from the day next preceding 45 the annual meeting of the Legislature," and substituting there-46 for the words, "for two years from the day next preceding 47 the biennial meeting of the Legislature." 48

Article nine, Section seven of the Amendments, is amended, 49 by striking out the words "annual election on the second Mon-50 day of September," and substituting therefor "biennial election on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November," 52 and is further amended, by striking out the words "September 53 election," and substituting therefor the words "November 54 election."
