RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the constitution of
Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution
2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of
3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

5 THE ELECTION OF GOVERNOR BY PLURALITY VOTE.

6 The Governor shall be elected by a plurality of votes, given
7 in by the qualified electors. The third Section of Article five,
8 Part first of the Constitution, is amended, by striking out the
9 word "majority" wherever it occurs in said Section, and
10 inserting instead thereof the word "plurality."
