RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution 2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of 3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

5 POWER OF GOVERNOR TO PARDON.

18 ditions, if any, upon which the same was granted.

Article five, Part first, Section eleven, shall be amended, by striking out of said Section all after the word "reprieves," and by adding thereto the following: Commutations and pardons, except in cases of impeachment, upon such conditions, and with such restrictions and limitations, as may be deemed proper, subject to such regulations as may be provided by law, relative to the manner of applying for pardons. And he shall communicate to the Legislature, at each session thereof, deach case of reprieve, remission of penalty, commutation or pardon granted, stating the name of the convict, the crime of which he was convicted, the sentence and its date, the date of the reprieve, remission, commutation, or pardon, and the con-
