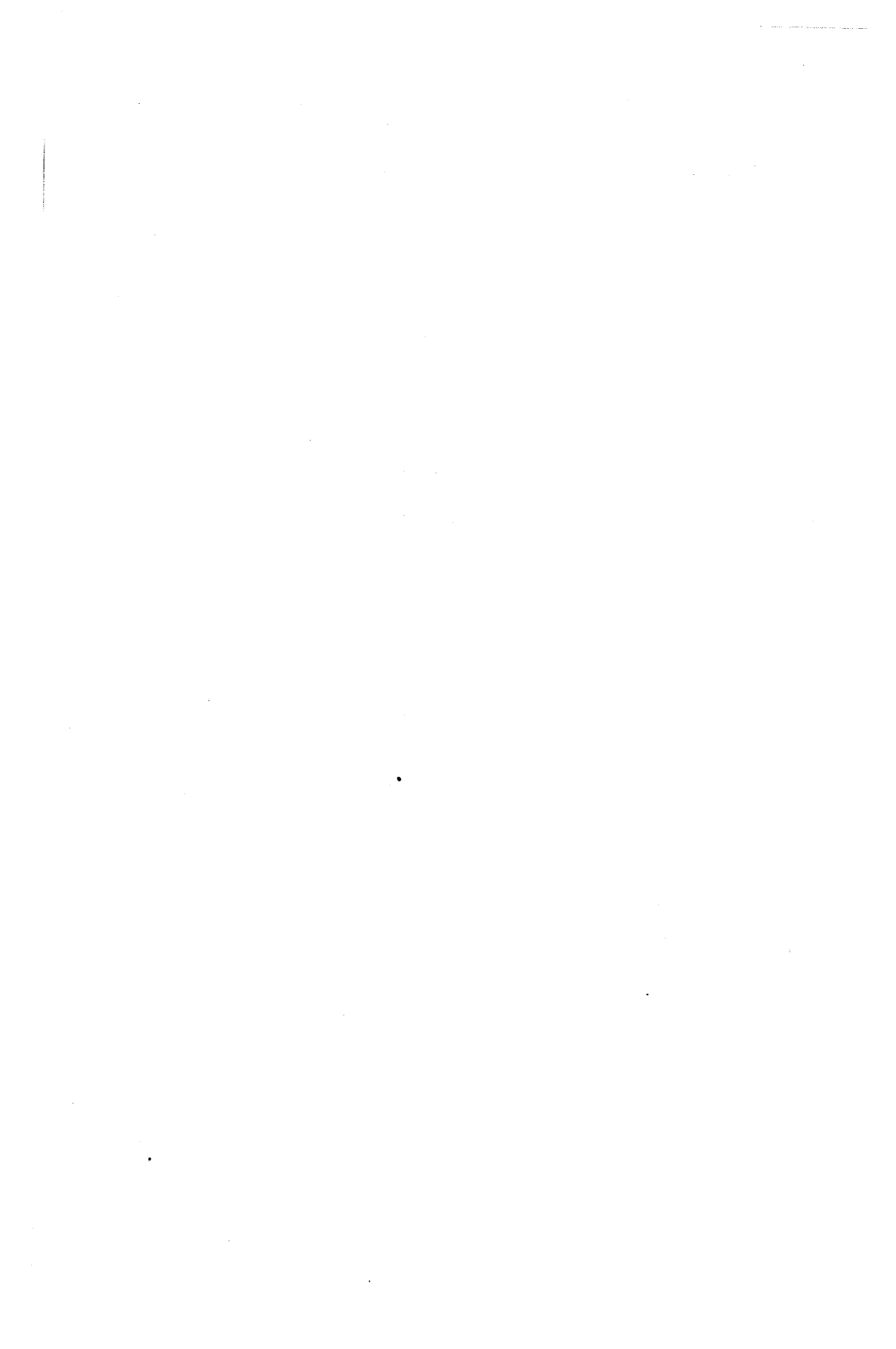
STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

[H. 47.] AN ACT for the protection of owners of stolen bonds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. No action shall be commenced or maintained by any person except the true owner thereof upon any stolen bonds or coupons unless commenced within twelve months after the cause of action accrues ; *provided only* that in case of stolen bonds or coupons now outstanding and overdue, no action shall be maintained unless commenced within six months from the passage of this act.
