STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

[S. 25.] AN ACT to secure the education of youth in the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. That every parent, guardian, or other
- 2 person in the State of Maine, having control of any
- 3 child or children between the ages of seven and fifteen.
- 4 years, shall be required to send such child or children
- 5 to a public school for a period of at least twelve weeks
- 6 in each year, unless such child or children are excused
- 7 from such attendance by the school officers of the town.
- 8 in which such parent or guardian resides, upon its-
- 9 being shown to their satisfaction that the mental or
- 10 bodily condition of such child or children has been
- 11 such as to prevent attendance at school or application
- 12 to study for the period required, or that such child or

- 13 children have been taught at a private school or at 14 home in such branches as are usually taught in pri15 mary schools; provided in case a public school shall 16 not be taught for three months in the year within one 17 and one-half miles by the shortest travelled road of the 18 residence of such delinquent, he shall not be liable to 19 the provisions of this act.
- SECT. 2. In case any parent, guardian, or other 2 person having such control, shall fail to comply with 3 section one of this act, he shall be liable to a fine not 4 exceeding five dollars and costs of prosecution for such 5 offence, to be recovered in any court competent to try 6 the same, and the magistrate or court to which said 7 fine shall be paid shall pay the same to the treasurer 8 of the town in which the offence was committed, and 9 shall be by him accounted for the same as money 10 raised for school purposes.
 - SECT. 3. Every boy in this state between the ages 2 of seven and fifteen years, who shall neglect or refuse 3 to attend school as required in section one of this act, 4 unless excused by the school officers of the city, town 5 or plantation in which he resides, on being convicted 6 of such offence, shall pay a fine not exceeding five 7 dollars, or be sentenced to the reform school, in the 8 discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the 9 offence is tried.

SECT. 4. It shall be the duty of the school commit-2 tee or town supervisor to enforce the several provisions 3 of this act.
