STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

[S. 55.] AN ACT repealing chapter three hundred and seventy-nine of acts and resolves of eighteen hundred and forty-six, and amending section fifty of chapter forty of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. That chapter three hundred and seventy-
- 2 nine, of the acts and resolves of eighteen hundred and
- 3 forty-six, is hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 2. Section fifty of chapter forty of the revised
- 2 statutes, be amended by striking out the words "the
- 3 eastern Penobscot river in Orland," in the sixth and
- 4 seventh lines of said section, so that said section shall
- 5 read:
- 6 "The following waters and their tributaries are ex-
- 7 empt from the operation of the provisions of this chap-

- 8 ter relating to the migratory fishes, and the supervision
- 9 of fishways by the commissioners, that is to say:
- 10 Royalls river in North Yarmouth; Sewall's pond, or its
- 11 outlet, in Arrowsic; Nequasset stream in Woolwich;
- 12 Damariscotta river; Duck Trap stream in Lincolnville
- 13 and Belmont; Winslow's and Leach's streams in
- 14 Penobscot; all waters in Vinalhaven, Bluehill, Tre-
- 15 mont, Mount Desert, Eden, Franklin and Sullivan;
- 16 Tunk river in Steuben; Pleasant river in Washington
- 17 county; East Machias river; and Cobscook or Orange
- 18 river in Whiting."
