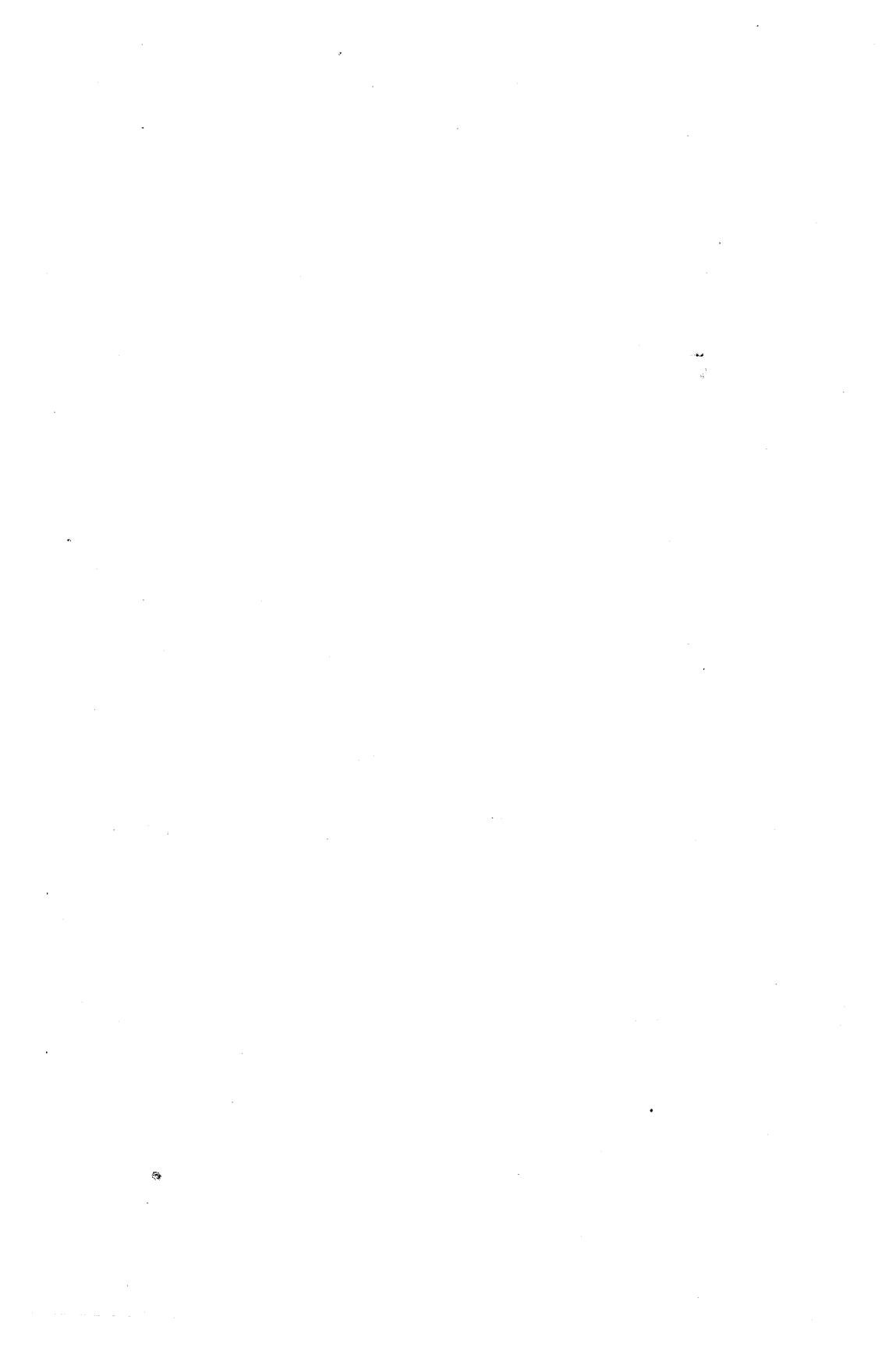
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

[H. 136.] AN ACT additional to chapter twenty-nine of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, concerning the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The volunteer company known as the
2 Biddeford Light Infantry, is hereby made subject to
3 all the duties and granted all the privileges provided
4 for volunteer companies of militia, by chapter twenty-
5 nine of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
