Amendment "A" to House Document No. 20.

STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

[H. 143.] AN ACT to provide for the appointment of deputy town treasurers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The treasurer of any town or plantation
2 may appoint a citizen of his town or plantation to act
3 as his deputy, during his temporary absence, or other
4 temporary disability. The appointment shall be in
5 writing and be a matter of record. It may be in the
6 form following:

7 I — — — hereby appoint — — — to perform
8 the duties of town treasurer of the town of — — —,
9 during the treasurer's temporary absence from his
10 office. — — —, Treasurer.

SECT. 2. The treasurer and the sureties upon his
2 official bond shall be responsible for all the acts and
3 omissions of his deputy in such office.

SECT. 3. In case of the death, resignation, removal,
2 or other permanent disability of a treasurer of a town
3 or plantation, the municipal officers may appoint a
4 citizen of such town or plantation to be treasurer,
5 until his successor shall be elected and qualified.
6 Such appointment shall be in writing and made a
7 matter of record. It may be in the form following :

8 We, the municipal officers of the town of———,
9 hereby appoint —— —— to be treasurer of said town
10 until his successor shall be elected and qualified.

SECT. 4. Before such appointee shall enter upon his
2 duties, he shall be duly sworn, and shall give bond to
3 the town for the faithful performance of the duties
4 of his office, in such sum, and with such sureties, as
5 the municipal officers shall order.
