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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE.

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[S. 74.] AN ACT to amend section four of chapter two hundred and three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, providing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter two hundred and three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

5 Sect. 4. No soldier who has served by enlistment  
6 in the army or navy of the United States, in the war  
7 of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and in consequence  
8 of injury sustained in said service, may become de-  
9 pendent upon any city or town in this state, shall be

10 considered a pauper, or subject to disfranchisement for  
11 that cause.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
