[No. 44.] RESOLVE in favor of Amos P. Cook.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be and is hereby
2 authorized to pay Amos P. Cook, the sum of seven
3 hundred and fifty-five dollars, (\$755) with interest
4 from May third, eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Land Agent, having seized certain horses, sleds, harnesses, &c., for trespass on lands which were in controversy between the State and the European and North American Railway, sold the same at public auction, with guaranty of title. Amos P. Cook bought some of these horses and harnesses and paid for them, which horses and harnesses were afterwards replevied from him and judgment was rendered against him. This resolve is to refund to him the money so paid by him, with interest.
