STATE OF MAINE.

[No. 47.] RESOLVE in aid of completing the road leading from Limestone to Hamlin.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be 2 and the same is hereby appropriated to complete the 3 road leading from Limestone to Hamlin plantation, the 4 same to be expended in township G, range one, 5 Aroostook county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There is a great thoroughfare leading from Calais, in Washington county, through the first range of townships, in Aroostook county, to the Saint John river in Hamlin plantation, of which only two miles in Township Letters F and G remain to be built, in order to complete said road, which is to be the great thoroughfare between the lower Saint John river region and the central and southern parts of Aroostook county; and until said two miles of road are built, the inhabitants of Hamlin, and the public generally, have to go round through the Province of New Brunswick in order to reach the other parts of the county. It is estimated that \$300, with the road labor which can be obtained from the settlers who have lots to pay for, will be sufficient to complete said road, so that the State will not be called upon for anything further at any future time.
