STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND HUNDRED AND EIGHT
SEVENTY-FIVE.

[S. 94.] AN ACT to amend the forty-eighth section of
the eighty-second chapter of the revised statutes, in
relation to demands filed in set off.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The forty-eighth section of the eighty-
2 second chapter of the revised statutes, is hereby
3 amended so as to read as follows, to wit:

4 *Sect. 48.* Demands between plaintiffs and defend-
5 ants may be set off against each other, as follows:
6 The defendant during the term to which the writ is
7 returnable, must file a brief statement of his demand
8 in substance as certain as a declaration which by leave

9 of the court may be amended. The clerk shall enter
10 on it, and on the docket the date, and on the docket
11 under the action notice of the filing.
