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## STATE OF MAINE.

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[No. 107.] RESOLVE in favor of Thomas Mathison.

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*Resolved,* That the sum of one hundred and fifty  
2 dollars be paid to Thomas Mathison in full for stump-  
3 age cut and hauled from lot number sixty-one, in  
4 Oakfield plantation, by permit from the state in  
5 eighteen hundred sixty-six, after said Mathison has  
6 purchased said lot from the state.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

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Said Thomas Mathison, in the winter held a certificate of lot 61 in Oakfield plantation, in the year 1866, and has since paid for said lot and received a deed. In the winter of 1866 the lumber was hauled from the lot by virtue of a permit from the Land Office to D. R. Stockwell of Bangor, and by him re-permitted to Palmer and Johnson of Bangor, and the stumpage paid to the State; and he asks that he may be reimbursed.
