STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT to protect Medomak river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall erect any 2 fish weirs in Medomak river in the town of Waldoboro' 3 between the lower bridge and a line crossing said river 4 at right angles at Hollis' point, or maintain or allow 5 to remain any fish weirs erected within said limits 6 previous to the passage and approval of this act, on 7 and after the first day of May, A. D. 1876, without 8 written permission from the harbor master by him 9 subscribed, and recorded by the clerk of said town of 10 Waldoboro'. All fish weirs erected contrary to the 11 provisions of this act, and all fish weirs now erected 12 that are maintained or allowed to remain on and after

13 said first day of May contrary to the provisions of this14 act shall be deemed a public nuisance and liable to15 abatement.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate any of the 2 provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of a 3 misdemeanor and liable to prosecution therefor by 4 indictment in any court of competent jurisdiction, and 5 upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine 6 not less than two hundred dollars nor more than five 7 hundred dollars and all expenses for an abatement or 8 removal of such fish weirs, and to stand committed 9 until he shall pay the same or give satisfactory security 10 therefor.

SECT. 3. The town of Waldoboro' at its annual 2 meeting for the choice of town officers, shall annually 3 choose a harbor master whose duty it shall be to attend 4 to the enforcement of the foregoing provisions, and for 5 which duty he shall be paid by said town a reasonable 6 compensation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
