STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX

AN ACT permitting the defendant to give bond in trustee process.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. In any suit hereafter brought in this 2 state, wherein any person, company or corporation is 3 summoned as a trustee of the defendant, the defendant 4 may deliver to the officer holding the writ, a bond, 5 running to the creditor, in the amount of the ad dam-6 num of the writ, with surety or sureties approved ac-7 cording to the provisions of section twenty-four of 8 chapter one hundred and thirteen of the revised stat-9 utes, conditional to pay whatever judgment may be 10 recovered against the defendant, and the taxable costs, 11 within thirty days from the date of final judgment in 12 said suit.

SECT. 2. When any officer shall receive any bond 2 according to the foregoing provisions, he shall imme-3 diately give written notice thereof to the trustee or 4 trustees, and he shall be allowed to charge as fees the 5 sum of fifty cents for each trustee so notified and for 6 his necessary travel.

SECT. 3. The officer shall file the bond in court with 2 the writ, and shall make return of his doings relative 3 thereto in his return upon the writ.

SECT. 4. When any person, company or corporation, 2 summoned as trustee in any action, shall be legally 3 notified that the defendant has given bond, as above 4 described, he or they shall be discharged from all fur-5 ther liability in said action, and any such trustee shall 6 not be required to make any disclosure into court, 7 and shall not recover any costs in said action.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
