STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Crystal plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be,
2 and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended
3 on the roads in Crystal plantation; four hundred dol-
4 lars to be expended on the county road leading from
5 the Belvidier bridge to the northwest corner of lot
6 number thirty-seven in Island Falls, and one hundred
7 on the second road in said Crystal plantation, to be
8 expended under the direction of the county commis-
9 sioners of Aroostook county, and the governor shall
10 draw his warrant for the amount when the county com-
11 missioners shall certify that the same has been properly
12 expended.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Crystal plantation has a population of two hundred and fifty inhabitants, fifty-six polls and a valuation of \$32,115.00. The tax-payers of said plantation have to build another road during the coming summer, for which purpose they will have to tax themselves to the amount of one thousand dollars. The roads referred to in the resolve will cost the plantation some four hundred dollars over and above the appropriation granted by said resolve. In addition to the above facts, the plantation last year raised five hundred dollars in cash by assessment and two hundred and fifty dollars by loan, over and above the usual amount of highway tax. The roads referred to in resolve must be built, and unless this appropriation be granted, it will be difficult for the inhabitants of said plantation to find the means to build the same.
