RESOLVE in favor of James M. Story.

Resolved, That the land agent be hereby directed to 2 convey to James M. Story, lot number fifty-six (56) 3 in the town of Washburn, waiving further settling 4 duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:

The undersigned, petitioner, certifies that he is the owner of land certificate for lot of land numbered fifty-six, (56) township thirteen, (13) range three, (3) now Washburn. That said lot lays adjacent to his farm and is not a settling lot, and that the said lot is destitute of timber, having been burnt over in 1864. That all of the road labor has been performed under the direction of the Land Agent, and that the said lot is necessary to his farm on account of water. Your petitioner therefore asks that the Land Agent be authorized to deed him the said lot waiving further settling duties, and as in duty bound would ever pray.
