STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of road passing through township F,
range one, Aroostook county.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be,
2 and the same is hereby appropriated in aid of the
3 road passing through township F, range one, Aroos-
4 took county, the same to be expended under the
5 superintendence of the county commissioners of said
6 county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road passing through Township F, Range one, leads from the settlements on the St. John river to Fort Fairfield, and is the shortest route from those settlements to the nearest railway station. The State has received \$6,300 from the sale of lands off of said Township during the past year, and it is believed that no more useful appropriation could be made than this small amount to make this road passable.
