STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-six, chapter ninety-one
of the revised statutes, in relation to lime-rock and
slate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section twenty-six of the ninety-first chapter of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the
3 fourth line of said section after the word vessel, “any
4 person who labors in quarrying, or cutting and dressing
5 granite in any quarry, has a lien for the wages of his
6 labor on all the granite quarried or cut and dressed in
7 the quarry by him or his co-laborers, for thirty days
8 after such granite is cut and dressed, or until such
9 granite is sold, or shipped on board a vessel,” so that
10 said section as amended shall read as follows :

11 *Sect. 26.* Any person who digs, hauls, or furnishes
12 rock for the manufacture of lime, has a lien thereon
13 for his personal services, and the rock so furnished, for
14 thirty days after such rock is manufactured into lime,
15 or until such lime is sold, or shipped on board a vessel ;
16 any person who labors in quarrying, or cutting and
17 dressing granite in any quarry, has a lien for the wages
18 of his labor on all the granite quarried, or cut and
19 dressed in the quarry by him or his co-laborers, for
20 thirty days after such granite is cut and dressed, or
21 until such granite is sold or shipped on board a vessel ;
22 any person who labors in mining, quarrying, or manu-
23 facturing slate in any quarry, has a lien for the wages
24 of his labor on all slate mined, quarried or manufact-
25 ured in the quarry by him or his co-laborers, for thirty
26 days after the slate arrives at their port of shipment.
27 Said liens shall have precedence of all other claims,
28 and may be enforced by attachment within the times
29 aforesaid.
