STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT in relation to the recording of assignments of
wages.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No assignment of wages, shall be valid
2 against any other person than the parties thereto,
3 unless such assignment is recorded by the clerk of the
4 city, town or plantation organized for any purpose, in
5 which the assignor is commorant, while earning such
6 wages.

SECT. 2. The fee to be paid the clerk for any such
2 record shall be twenty-five cents.
