## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT to amend section thirty-eight of chapter ninetyone of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives: in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty-eight of chapter ninety-one of revised 2 statutes is hereby amended, by striking out the words 3 a manner hereinafter provided, and adding thereto the 4 words in the manner following, after such goods or 5 personal baggage have remained in the possession of 6 such innholder or boarding house keeper for the period 7 of six months unredeemed, the same may be sold by 8 auction to pay the sum due for board or lodging, and 9 the expense of advertising and selling the same. Be-10 fore selling any such articles as aforesaid the inn-11 holders or boarding house keeper holding the same,

12 shall give thirty days notice of the time and place of 13 such sale in a newspaper published in the town or 14 city where such articles are held, and if no newspaper 15 is published in such town or city, notice shall be 16 posted in three conspicuous places in such town or 17 city of the time and place of sale; said notice shall 18 give a description of such articles, and the name of 19 the owner, and the proceeds of sale after deducting all 20 charges and expense of advertising said sale shall be 21 applied in satisfaction of the claim upon which such 22 articles are sold, and the balance, if any, held for the 23 benefit of the person entitled thereto. All sales under 24 the provisions of this section shall be recorded in the 25 office of the town clerk where such sale takes place, 26 in a book kept for that purpose, in which the articles 27 sold shall be correctly described, and the charges and 28 expenses of advertising and selling, and the prices at 29 which they were sold, and such book shall be open to 30 the inspection of all, so that said section, as amended, 31 shall read as follows:

Sect. 38. Innholders or keepers of boarding houses 33 have a lien on the goods and personal baggage of their 34 boarders to secure the payment of any money due 35 from them for board or lodging, and may enforce the 36 same by a sale of such goods or baggage in the man-37 ner following. After such goods or personal baggage

38 have remained in the possession of such innholders or 39 boarding house keeper for the period of six months un-40 redeemed, the same may be sold at auction to pay the 41 sum due for board or lodging, and the expense of 42 advertising and selling the same. Before selling any 43 such articles as aforesaid, the innholder or boarding 44 house keeper holding the same shall give thirty days 45 notice of the time and place of such sale in a news-46 paper published in the town or city where such articles 47 are held, and if no newspaper is published in such 48 town or city notice shall be posted in three conspicuous 49 places in such town or city, of the time and place of 50 sale; said notice shall give a description of such 51 articles, and the name of the owner, and the proceeds 52 of sale after deducting all charges and expense of 53 advertising said sale, shall be applied in satisfaction of 54 the claim upon which such articles are sold, and the 55 balance, if any, held for the benefit of the person 56 entitled thereto. All sales under the provisions of 57 this section shall be recorded in the office of the town 58 clerk where such sale takes place, in a book kept for 59 that purpose, in which the articles sold shall be cor-60 rectly described, and the charges and expense of 61 advertising and selling, and the prices at which they 62 were sold, and such book shall be open to the in-63 spection of all.
