STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT additional to and amendatory of chapter two hundred and seventy-four of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, relating to armories for military companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Chapter two hundred and fifty-seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four is hereby amended, by striking out the word "one" in the fifth line, and inserting the word "three" instead thereof, and by striking out the word "may" in the same line, and inserting the word "shall" instead thereof, and by adding to said section the following words, "but in no case shall any city or town receive a larger sum than is actually expended by such city or town for the

10 rent of such armory or place of deposit," so that
11 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

12 *Sect. 2.* Section eighty-six of the public laws of the
13 year eighteen hundred and sixty-five is hereby amended
14 by adding the following, "and a reasonable compen-
15 sation for rent of any such armory or place of deposit
16 not exceeding the sum of three hundred dollars per
17 annum shall be allowed to the city or town so furnish-
18 ing such armory or place of deposit, and paid from
19 the state treasury, but in no case shall any city or
20 town receive a larger sum than is actually expended
21 by such city or town for the rent of such armory or
22 place of deposit."
