STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

AN ACT relating to the settlement of the public lands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The land agent, under the direction of 2 the governor and council, or such other person as may 3 be authorized thereto, shall convey any lots or parts 4 thereof which have been surveyed according to law, 5 at the price of twenty cents per acre to actual settlers, 6 and no more than one hundred and sixty acres shall 7 be sold to any one person.

SECT. 2. The purchaser shall give for such lands 2 two notes, payable in one and two years, in labor on 3 the roads in the township where the land lies, and 4 shall establish his residence on his lot within two years 5 from the date of his certificate; and a certificate,

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6 which shall not be assignable, shall be given, stating7 that he has become a purchaser of said lot therein8 described, and that he will be entitled to a deed when9 he complies with the requirements of the law.

SECT. 3. All road labor to be performed under the 2 provisions of this act or former acts, shall be done 3 under the direction of the persons named in the first 4 section of this act.

SECT. 4. All persons who are actual settlers, now 2 holding certificates, shall be entitled to deeds upon the 3 same conditions and requirements as are provided in 4 section two of this act.

SECT. 5. All laws in any way conflicting with the 2 provisions of this act, are, so far as relates to it, 3 hereby repealed.
