STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

[H. R. 2.] AN ACT to amend section one of chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes, relating to auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter thirty-four of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended in the second line
3 by striking out the word "county" and inserting in-
4 stead thereof the word "town," so that said section
5 as amended shall read as follows:

6 "The municipal officers of any town may license
7 any suitable inhabitants of their town by a writing
8 under their hands, to be auctioneers for one year in
9 any town in said county, and shall record every such
10 license in a book kept by them for that purpose.

11 Persons so licensed may be exempted from any lia-
12 bility to deduct two and one-half per cent. from the
13 gross amount of sales as provided in section three.”
