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## STATE OF MAINE.

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[S. 8.] RESOLVE in favor of Samuel C. Greenlow of  
Chapman plantation.

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*Resolved,* That the land agent be hereby directed to  
2 indorse on a note given by C. F. A. Johnson and Phair,  
3 April sixteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, for  
4 six hundred dollars, payable to the order of Parker P.  
5 Burleigh, land agent, the sum of three hundred dollars  
6 and interest on said three hundred dollars since April  
7 sixteenth, eighteen hundred and seventy-five.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

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Samuel C. Greenlow, in the winter of 1875, had a Land Certificate of lot numbered 96, in Chapman plantation, which he had taken up and settled upon under the provisions of the Settling Act. Since that time he has completed the settling duties, paid for said lot 96, and obtained his deed under said act of said lot, and it is his farm and home.

While he had the certificate from the Land Office, and before he had received his deed, he cut and hauled from said lot the spruce timber growing thereon. The Land Agent surveyed the logs, and C. F. A. Johnson & Phair gave a note of \$600 to settle for this and some other lumber. The amount in said \$600 note which was given for and in behalf of said Greenlow, was \$384.16. Said note has not been paid. It has seemed that said Greenlow should be allowed \$300 of said sum by indorsement on said note, as the remaining \$84.16 will amply remunerate the State for all costs and expenses.
