## STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

[S. 4.] AN ACT amending section twenty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the revised statutes, in relation to labor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twenty of chapter one hundred and twenty-2 four, is hereby amended by adding these words: "But 3 the mayor and aldermen of any city, and the municipal 4 officers of any town, by a writing under their hands, 5 may license any barber to keep open his shop in such 6 city or town solely for the exercise of his business as a 7 barber, during such hours of the forenoon of the Lord's 8 day as they may deem fit. Every such license shall 9 be recorded in a book kept by such officers for that 10 purpose. And no one acting under such license shall

11 be liable to the fine herein prescribed." So that said12 section as amended shall read as follows:

"Whoever, on the Lord's day, keeps open his shop, 13 14 workhouse, warehouse or place of business, travels or 15 does any work, labor or business on that day, except 16 work of necessity or charity, uses any sport, game or 17 recreation, or is present at any dancing, public diver-18 sion, show or entertainment, encouraging the same, 19 shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars. 20 But the mayor and aldermen of any city, and the mu-21 nicipal officers of any town, by a writing under their 22 hands, may license any barber to keep open his shop 23 in such city or town, solely for the exercise of his busi-24 ness as a barber, during such hours of the forenoon of 25 the Lord's day as they may deem fit. Every such 26 license shall be recorded in a book kept by such officers And no one acting under such 27 for that purpose. .28 license shall be liable to the fine herein prescribed."
