STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

[S. 63.] AN ACT to amend sections eleven and fifteen of chapter fifty-nine of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifteen of chapter fifty-nine of the revised 2 statutes, is hereby amended, by striking out the words 3 "annually by the fifteenth of April," and substituting 4 therefor the words, "by the fifteenth day of each 5 month," and by striking out the words "the year 6 ending the last day of March," and substituting there-7 for the words, "for the preceding month," so that 8 said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

9 "Every person, commissioned as aforesaid, shall
10 keep a record of all marriages solemnized by him, and,
11 by the fifteenth day of each month, make return there-

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12 of for the preceding month, to the clerk of the town 13 where the marriage is solemnized, certifying the 14 names of the parties, the places of their residence, and 15 the date of the marriage; and for any neglect to do 16 so, he shall forfeit the sum of fifty dollars, one-half to 17 the use of the county, and the other to the use of the 18 person suing therefor."

19 Section eleven of the same chapter, is hereby 20 amended, by striking out the words "and council," in 21 the fifth line, so that said section, as amended, shall 22 read as follows :

23 "Every justice of the peace appointed for a county 24 or for the state, and residing therein; and every 25 ordained minister of the gospel, and every person 26 licensed to preach by an association of ministers, relig-27 ious seminary, or ecclesiastical body, duly appointed 28 and commissioned for that purpose by the governor, 29 may solemnize marriages within the limits of their 30 appointment."
