SEVENTY-SIX.

[S. 69.] AN ACT to amend section seventy-three,  
chapter two of the revised statutes, relating to the state  
library.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section seventy-three, chapter two of the revised  
2 statutes, is hereby amended, by adding after the  
3 words, "during the session of the board" in the  
4 tenth line, "county commissioners of Kennebec county  
5 during their regular sessions at Augusta," so that said  
6 section shall read as follows :

7 *Sect. 73.* Books may be taken from the library by  
8 the governor, members of the council and of the legis-  
9 lature, judges of the judicial courts, secretary of state,  
10 deputy secretary of state, treasurer of state, adjutant

11 general, attorney general, land agent, reporter of de-  
12 cisions, counsel engaged in the argument of causes  
13 before the law courts in the middle district, superin-  
14 tendent of public buildings, superintendent of common  
15 schools, superintendent of the insane hospital, chap-  
16 lains, secretary and assistant secretary of the senate,  
17 chaplains, clerk and assistant clerk of the house,  
18 secretary and members of the board of agriculture  
19 during the session of the board, county commissioners  
20 of Kennebec county during their regular session at  
21 Augusta; but this privilege to the members of the  
22 legislature and those officially connected therewith, is  
23 limited to the time the legislature is in session. Any  
24 person taking books from the library, shall first give  
25 sufficient personal security for their return within  
26 twenty days.
