STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-SIX.

[S. 72.] AN ACT to amend section twenty of chapter
twenty-seven of the revised statutes, in relation to
persons who travel and sell intoxicating liquors by
order, or samples.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section twenty of chapter twenty-seven of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended, by striking out the words
3 “not less than twenty, nor more than,” between the
4 word “penalty” in the sixth line, and the word
5 “one” in the seventh line, and inserting between the
6 words “dollars” and “offer” in the seventh line,
7 the words “for the first offence, and two hundred
8 dollars fine, and costs, and in addition thereto three
9 months imprisonment for the second offence, and for

10 each subsequent," so that said section, as amended,
11 shall read as follows :

12 *Sect. 20.* No person shall travel from town to
13 town, or from place to place, in any city, town or
14 plantation in this state, on foot or by any kind of land
15 or water, public or private conveyance whatever,
16 carrying for sale, or offering for sale, or offering to
17 obtain, or obtaining orders for the sale or delivery of
18 any spirituous, intoxicating or fermented liquors, in
19 any quantity, under a penalty of one hundred dollars
20 for the first offence, and two hundred dollars fine and
21 costs, and in addition thereto, three months imprison-
22 ment for the second offence, and for each subsequent
23 offer to take an order, and for each order taken, and
24 for each sale so made, to be collected on complaint or
25 by indictment before any court competent to try the
26 same ; one-half of such fine to the complainant, and
27 the other half to the county in which the offence is
28 committed.
