STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 35.] RESOLVE in aid of the road through Dunn's
notch in Oxford county.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred dollars is
2 hereby appropriated for building a road through Dunn's
3 notch, so called, in Oxford county, the same to be
4 expended under the direction of the county commis-
5 sioners ; and to be paid to said county commissioners,
6 upon their filing with the state treasurer a certificate,
7 under oath, that a good and substantial road has been
8 completed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1873 the County Commissioners of Oxford county located a road through Dunn's notch, so called, in Andover North Surplus, it being the most convenient route for travel from the central part of the State to New Hampshire and the Provinces, affording a direct and feasible road through Errol, Dixville notch, to the valley of the Connecticut river. The location, as made by said commissioners, was for the purpose of avoiding a very difficult and hilly road, almost impassable in the Spring and Fall. The expense of building is estimated at twenty-five hundred dollars, an amount which the inhabitants of Andover North Surplus are unable to pay; that the County Commissioners proposed to assess five hundred dollars upon said county in aid of said road, upon condition that the balance of two thousand dollars be otherwise raised.
