STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT additional relating to corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Except where otherwise provided by 2 statute, whenever at any meeting of the stockholders 3 of any corporation legally called therefor, such stock-4 holders may vote or have voted to dissolve such cor-5 poration, a bill in equity against said corporation for 6 dissolution thereof, may be filed by any officer, stock-7 holder or creditor of said corporation in the supreme 8 judicial court, in the county in which said corporation 9 has an established place of business, or in the county 10 in which it held its last stockholders' meeting, upon 11 which bill notice shall be given as may be ordered by

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12 any justice of said court, in term time or vacation,13 upon proof of which notice such proceedings may be14 had according to the usual course of suits in equity,15 that said corporation shall be dissolved and terminated.

Sect. 2. Said court shall have jurisdiction in said 2 cause to appoint receivers, issue injunctions, and pass 3 interlocutory decrees and orders according to the usual 4 course of proceedings in equity; and shall moreover 5 upon dissolving said corporation or upon terminating 6 its charter, appoint one or more trustees who shall 7 have all the powers conferred upon similar trustees by 8 revised statutes, chapter forty-six, (46) sections eigh-9 teen, nineteen and twenty, or by the statute approved 10 February twenty-four, eighteen hundred and seventy-11 one, entitled, "an act fixing the liability of stock-12 holders in corporations," or by any other statute or 13 law of the state, and also all such special powers as 14 may be properly given them by said court. But not-15 withstanding the appointment of such trustees said 16 court may superintend the collection and distribution 17 of the assets of said corporation and may retain said 18 bill for that purpose.

SECT. 3. Nothing herein contained shall be con-2 strued to relieve any officer, shareholder or other per3 son from any liability to which he would be subject if4 this act had not been passed.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect on approval by 2 the governor.
