STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT amendatory of chapter one hundred and twentyfive of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventysix, for the protection of land-locked salmon, trout and bass.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sections one, two, three, of the public laws of 2 eighteen hundred and seventy-six, are hereby amended, 3 so as to read as follows:

4 Sect. 1. There shall be an annual close-time for 5 land-locked salmon, commonly so-called trout, black 6 bass and Oswego bass, in all the waters of this state, 7 as follows, viz: For land-locked salmon from the 8 fifteenth day of September to the first day of March

9 following; for trout, so that they shall not be taken
10 for the purpose of sale from the first day of October
11 to the first day of March following, or for any purpose
12 from the first day of October to the first day of Jan13 uary following; and the black bass and Oswego bass,
14 from the first day of April to the first day of June
15 following.

16Sect. 2. No person shall at any time catch, take, 17 kill or fish for any land-locked salmon, trout, black 18 bass or Oswego bass, by means of any grapnel, spear, 19 trawl, weir, net, seine or trap, under a penalty of not 20 less than ten nor more than thirty dollars for each 21 offence, and a further fine of one dollar for each 22 fish so caught, taken or killed; and all grapnels, 23 spears, trawls, weirs, nets, seines and traps are hereby 24 prohibited on the fresh water lakes, ponds and streams 25 of this state; and when found in use or operation on 26 said lakes, ponds or streams, they are hereby declared 27 forfeit and contraband, and any person finding them in 28 use in said waters is hereby authorized to destroy the 29same.

30 Sect. 3. No person shall catch, take, kill, expose 31 for sale or have in possession, except alive, any land-32 locked salmon between the fifteenth day of September 33 and the first day of March following, or any trout 34 between the first day of October and the first day of

35 January following; and no person shall sell or expose 36 for sale, any trout, except alive, between the first day 37 of October and the first day of March following; or 38 any black bass or Oswego bass between the first day 39 of April and the first day of June following, under a 40 penalty of not less than ten dollars, nor more than 41 thirty dollars for each offence, and a further fine of 42 one dollar for each fish thus caught, taken, killed, sold 43 or exposed for sale, or in possession contrary to the 44 provisions in this section.
