STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to prevent loitering, without right, within the
station houses, or about the premises of railroad corpo-
rations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall loiter or re-
main, without right, within any car station house of a
railroad corporation, or upon the platforms or grounds
adjoining such station, after being requested to leave
the same by any railroad officer.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of
section one of this act, shall be subject to a fine of not
less than two nor more than ten dollars.

SECT. 3. Trial justices in there several counties,
judges of municipal and police courts in the respective

3 cities, shall have jurisdiction of all complaints under
4 this act, subject to appeal to the supreme judicial
5 court.

SECT. 4. It shall be the duty of the officers of the
2 several railroad corporations in the state to have
3 posted in a conspicuous place at the several depots
4 along the line of the road of the company a copy of
5 the above law.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
