RESOLVE in favor of Charles G. Perry.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby au-

- 2 thorized to convey to Charles G. Perry, lot number
- 3 fifty-eight, in Chapman plantation, on satisfactory
- 4 evidence that said Perry is the actual owner of the
- 5 certificate of said lot, waiving further settling duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:

We the undersigned, respectfully represent that Charles G. Perry of Presque Isle, Maine, is the lawful owner of the land certificate of lot No. 58 in Chapman plantation, in Aroostook county, Maine. That all the road labor has been performed in payment for said lot, to the acceptance of the Land Agent, with a clearing of fifteen acres, and a comfortable dwelling house thereon; that owing to unavoidable circumstances he has not established his own residence thereon, but has a tenant living on the lot at the present time as an actual settler.

Wherefore, we ask that an act be passed at the present Legislature, authorizing the Land Agent to deed said lot to said Perry without the performance of further settling duties, and as in duty bound will ever pray.
