STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section fifty-six of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes, relating to weights and measures of agricultural products.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifty-six of chapter thirty-eight of the revised 2 statutes, is hereby amended, by striking out the word 3 "thirty" in the ninth line of said section, and insert-4 ing the word "thirty-two" instead thereof, so that 5 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

6 Sect. 56. The standard weight of a bushel of pota-7 toes, in good order and fit for shipping, shall be sixty 8 pounds; of corn, fifty-six pounds; of barley and buck-9 wheat, forty-eight pounds; of carrots, fifty pounds; 10 of onions, in good order and fit for shipping, fifty-two

11 pomnds; of ruta baga, sugar beets, mangel wurzle 12 and turnip beets, in like condition, sixty pounds; of 13 English turnips, in like condition, fifty pounds; of 14 beans, sixty-four pounds; of peas, sixty pounds; of 15 rye and Indian meal, fifty pounds; of oats, thirty-two 16 pounds, or strike measure; and of hair used in 17 masonry, well dried and cleansed, eleven pounds; and 18 the measure of each of these articles shall be deter-19 mined as aforesaid at the request of the vender or 20 vendee; and if either party refuses so to do, he shall 21 forfeit twenty cents for each bushel to the person 22 prosecuting therefor within thirty days.
