STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT relative to proceedings in court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That in all criminal cases the defendant may demur,

- 2 and in case the demurrer is not sustained, may plead
- 3 over at the same term at which the demurrer is over-
- 4 ruled. Provided, that where exceptions are filed to
- 5 the rulings of the presiding judge upon the demurrer,
- 6 said cause shall be in order for trial as if no demurrer
- 7 had been filed.
