STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. In order to provide for the several acts
2 and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment
3 of money from the treasury, and also to provide for
4 the necessary expenditures of government for the cur-
5 rent fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appro-
6 priated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the
7 governor, with the advice and consent of the council,
8 is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day
9 of January next, to draw his warrant on the treasury
10 for the same :
