STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe
of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury
2 to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, to be
3 appropriated for the benefit of the said tribe, as follows:
4 Forty-four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and seventy
5 cents, amount of interest on their trust fund, held by
6 the state for the benefit of said tribe ; eighteen hun-
7 dred dollars for their annual annuity ; eight hundred
8 dollars for agricultural purposes ; four hundred dollars
9 for bounty on crops ; three hundred dollars for salary
10 of agent ; one hundred and fifty dollars to pay com-
11 petent persons, to be employed by the agent, to assist
12 and instruct said indians in their agricultural labors,
13 as follows : seventy-five dollars on Oldtown and Orson
14 islands, thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents on Hemlock,
15 Sugar and Olamon islands, thirty-seven dollars and

16 fifty cents on Mattanawcook island, on the same con-
17 ditions as required by chapter ninety-six of the re-
18 solves of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven; the fol-
19 lowing sums appropriated to be paid from their shore
20 rents: four hundred and fifty dollars for schools, to be
21 used in employing competent teachers, viz: two hun-
22 dred and fifty dollars on Oldtown island, under the
23 supervision of the superintending school committee of
24 Oldtown; one hundred dollars on Olamon island, under
25 the supervision of the superintending school committee
26 of Greenbush; one hundred dollars on Mattanawcook
27 island, under the superintending school committee of
28 Lincoln, and said committees are required to report as
29 directed in resolve approved March, seventeenth, eigh-
30 teen hundred and sixty; and it is the duty of said
31 agent to see that the money is fully expended for the
32 education of the children of said tribe; one hundred
33 dollars for salary of their priest, *provided* he says mass
34 at least twenty-four Sundays during the year with said
35 tribe of Indians; fifty dollars for salary of their gov-
36 ernor; thirty dollars for salary of their lieutenant
37 governor. All the above named sums to be paid under
38 the direction of the governor and council.
