STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to incorporate the Bangor board of trade.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Be it known, that R. S. Prescott, B. F. 2 Tefft, J. S. Wheelwright, J. D. Warren, Charles Hay-3 ward, T. N. Egery, William Flowers, J. C. White, 4 Geo. W. Merrill, Henry Lord, Silas C. Hatch, J. S. 5 Jenness, Wm. E. Mann, J. P. Bass, Joseph F. Snow, 6 I. W. Coombs, James Tobin, James Adams, Frank 7 Hight, R. S. Morrison, John L. Cutler, J. M. Bragg, 8 their associates and successors, are hereby made a 9 corporation by the name of the Bangor Board of Trade, 10 for the purpose of promoting trade and commerce in 11 the city of Bangor and its vicinity, with all the powers 12 and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities

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13 and restrictions, set forth in the — section of the —
14 chapter of the revised statutes of Maine.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-2 sonal estate to an amount not exceeding twenty-five 3 thousand dollars, to be devoted exclusively to the pur-4 poses of said corporation.
