STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT additional to chapter twenty-nine of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, concerning the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The volunteer company known as “Richards’ Light
2 Infantry,” is hereby made subject to all the duties
3 and granted all the privileges, provided for volunteer
4 companies of militia, by chapter twenty-nine of the
5 public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine.
