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## STATE OF MAINE.

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[S. 2.] RESOLVE in favor of the town of Woodland.

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*Resolved*, That there be paid by the state treasurer out  
2 of the school fund to the town of Woodland, the sum  
3 of one hundred and sixteen dollars and fifteen cents,  
4 it being the balance due them for the year eighteen  
5 hundred seventy-five.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

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The Supervisor of Schools in the town of Woodland, for the year 1875, gave in her return the number of scholars 178, but placed on the outside 112. The State Superintendent of Schools, in giving the returns to the State Treasurer, gave the number on the outside, 112, or sixty-six less than the number on which the town was entitled to draw school money. The \$116.15 given in the resolve is the amount due on the 66 scholars omitted.
